Barcelona Activa is the Economic Development Agency of the City of Barcelona. It has the aim to promote economic and local development to ensure a better quality of life for the citizens by designing and implementing entrepreneurship, employment, training and business support policies. Barcelona Activa has four main areas of activity:

- 1. Job search: provide support to citizens in their job search process. In fact, the employment has been defined as a mainstreaming and core policy of Barcelona Activa.
- 2. Entrepreneurship: offer support to entrepreneurs in order to transform their ideas into feasible new businesses and support to SMEs and organizations to grow.
- 3. Training: provide specialized and technology training to professionals, entrepreneurs and SMEs.
- 4. Sustainable economic development: promotion of new economic activity, making it sustainable and rooted in the different territories of the city.

Barcelona Activa takes part in the Barcelona Employment bureau, devoted to reducing the unemployment rates of the city and to reinforce the employability of the population of the city.

The City Council of Barcelona launched in November 2016 the Plan to foster Quality Employment for Youth, including 39 activity lines especially designed for young people.

Barcelona Activa 2016 data related to training activities:

- 4.000 short term training activities organised in the fields of entrepreneurship, companies' management and IT, attended by 14.742 people.
- 10.610 attendees to specific IT training courses.
- Training activities designed to foster employment including the Barcelona Employment Plan and the Barcelona Employment Plan for Youth, providing training to 3.532 unemployed people.

• 9.000 people under 30 have been supported through several programmes to improve their

employability. The employment orientation is core when designing and implementing activities for this target group.

 2.208 people living in deprived neighborhoods in Barcelona have been couched to improve their employability and employment skills.

The Kranj School Centre was formed by the merge of Technical School Centre Kranj and The Economy and Service School Centre of Kranj. Thus The School Centre continues and combines the rich tradition of secondary education schools of Kranj, which began after the Second World War.

In all units, educational work takes place in modern lecture halls, classrooms, laboratories and workshops. All employees are committed to act in the spirit of user-friendly educational institutions. The School Centre has signed agreements with more than 300 companies and organizations where pupils and students can perform practical training. Throughout history, adult education has been carried out in parallel with the regular education of young students. Content and programs have been bound to the programs of regular education and skills needed in the companies of the region. Kranj School Centre consists of five organizational units:

Secondary Technical School (with programs of informatics, electrotechnics and mechatronics), Secondary School for Economy, Services and Civil Engineering,

Specialist Grammar School,

Vocational College (Mechatronics, Informatics, Electroenergetics, Economy)

Inter-company Training Centre: cooperation between school centre and economy.

In the programs of secondary vocational and technical school, 1,700 students are involved while 600 students attend the programs of the vocational college and around 300 people are attending programs for adult education.

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School centre Kranj is actively involved in projects in regional, Slovene and international level (ESF, INTERREG, CENTRAL EUROPE, LLP, ERASMUS +...). School is very active in the field of RES and EE.

In the programs of electroenergetics and civil engineering we are developing info center for RES and EE for Gorenjska region. Last year we opened Haas Technical Education Center. This way we enabled access to higher quality education in the field of CNC technology for all participants of our education and partners in the region.

Knarvik vidaregåande skule (KNV) is an upper secondary school offering both vocational and general education. KNV is located 25 km to the north of Bergen. It is one of the biggest school in the county with about 1000 students and 180 staff. The school has a very good reputation and there are many applicants to our educational programmes. The school has developed an education programme which at the same time offers both general and vocational training and opens the pathways to studies at university and college level (TAF). This is done in very close contact with the industry, both private and public. The school is located in an area with strong mechanical industries. The oil industry and the oil industry suppliers play a major role in the economy. At the same time many people work in Bergen and are commuting to work there. The enterprises in the region are very dynamic and have broad contacts with their markets abroad.

KNV has many international activities and highly motivated teachers.

Municipality of Fjell is a modern and active community on the islands west of Bergen; consisting of 500 small and bigger islands, an area of 147 km², 25000 inhabitants, rapid growth - both in population and industry. Fjell is connected with the mainland by a bridge. Oil-related industry, technology and services are the main sources for employment and income. The Coast Center Base and Ågotnes, located in Fjell are the main centres for supplies and services for oil and gas industry in North Sea.

Fjell municipality focus on providing services near where people live. The municipality has 30 kindergartens for 2000 children,16 primary schools, one cultural school, adult education, and upper secondary school. The health services are well developed with a wide range of services of high quality. Facilities for cultural activities, sports and an active social life are well developed with good facilities. Fjell municipality are recognizing the importance of an attractive regional centre, and have an active involvement in the development of Straume into a coastal town.

The municipality provide training possibilities for 80 upper secondary students.

Hordaland County Council is one of 18 regional level organisations, covering 33 municipalities with a population of 500 000. HCC are responsible for regional development and planning, public transport, county roads, upper secondary education (there are also private providers), public dental services. HCC is also having active roles in supporting business development, cultural activities, sport facilities, environmental friendly development and establishment of infrastructure etc.

Hordaland County Council employ 4370 persons, out of this 3000 teachers. Operate 33 upper secondary schools with 18 000 students. Operate 47 dental clinics with 360 employees. treating ?? patients.

HCC maintain and improve 3000 km of roads, operate 19 ferry crossings, 9 public transport boat routes, 800 busses driving 35 mill km/year, Bergen Light Rail. In total providing 60 mill travels annually.

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
